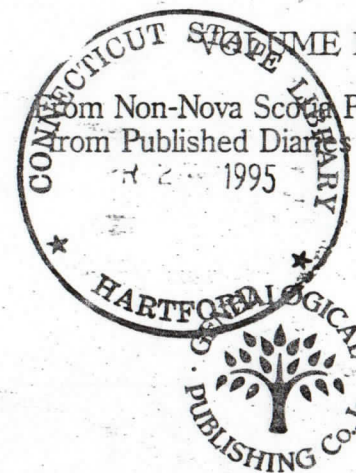

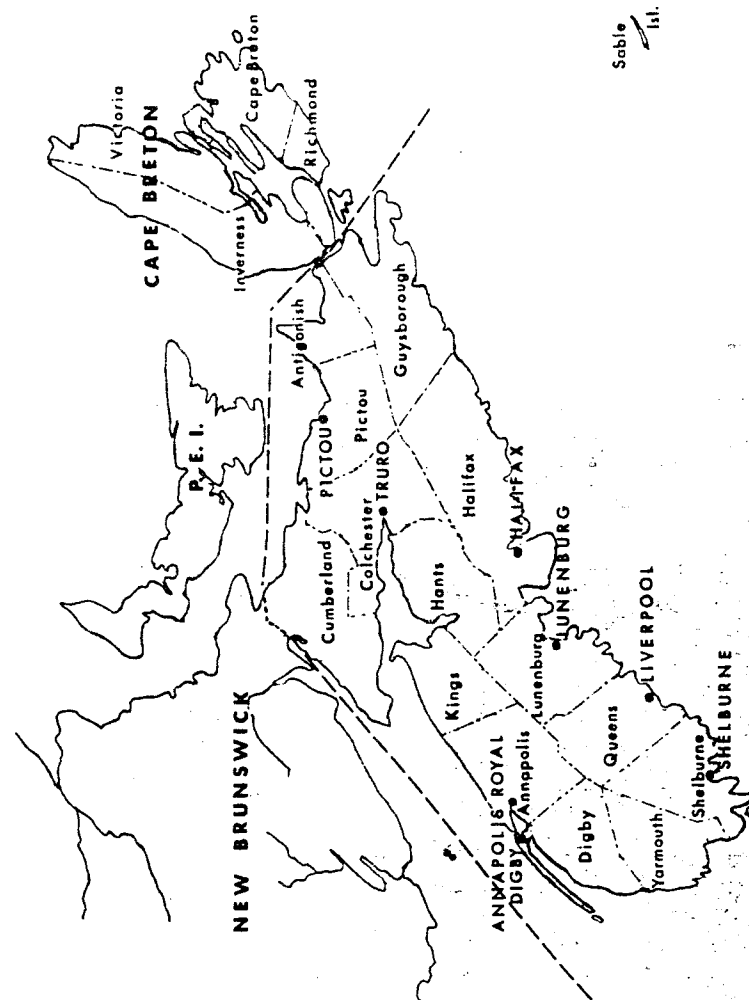
PREFACE

This volume is the second in a series designed to help searchers for Nova Scotia genealogical data, and results from my own ancestry problems. I am sure its users will be well aware of the problems in tracing Nova Scotia ancestors, and hope these volumes are of genuine assistance.

It deals with information abstracted from periodicals published outside Nova Scotia. "We Lived," perhaps unfamiliar, is from New Brunswick. Its pagination was somewhat irregular; the page numbers shown are those resulting from a sequential reassignment of page numbers. The number of pages published is not great; it is hoped the pagination will not interfere with the use of the data.

In the first volume of this series I gave some detail of the problems I encountered tracing my father's family; he came to the United States in 1883. His mother, Mary Ann Doyle, who came a few years later, and whom I knew, was the daughter of Joseph Doyle and Elizabeth Dousset, both Roman Catholics, but who were married in the Anglican Church at Digby - for what reason remains as yet unexplained. Elizabeth Dousset's mother was Anne Lanoue, the daughter of Pierre Lanoue and Mary Doane, as is recorded in the Township Book at Liverpool. It is not clear how they first met, but Pierre had been a victim of the deportation of the Acadians in 1755. Mary Doane was from Chatham, Mass., and went to Nova Scotia with her mother and stepfather in 1760 or 1761. Like many of the Chatham people, her roots trace to the MAYFLOWER.

Joseph Doyle died a widower in 1851 or 1852, leaving his daughter Mary Anne, then 15, to the care of Timothy Deveau and having deeded his property to that neighbor in return for maintenance until his death. He left one son, who made his way to San

Francisco, where he married, had a child, and died. A potential father could be Edward Doyle, who was present at Sissiboo (now Weymouth) at the proper time, according to Isaiah W. Wilson's *Digby County*. As you might guess, that work is unindexed and there is only one mention of him, which says he came from New Brunswick. No success has been found there, either.

This volume is limited to persons who entered British controlled Nova Scotia prior to the Confederation of Canada in 1867. The geographical area with which it deals is shown on the map opposite this page; it will be noted that the Island of Cape Breton is not included.

Modern computer technologies control the division of words, perhaps rather differently than usually expected. Revision of a line-by-line basis would have involved an inordinate amount of time and effort and greatly delayed this publication. It is therefore hoped that this anomaly will be pardoned.

I trust the inevitable errors will be few in number and not serious.
