I had a great visit with Vivian Broberg when she came to Oklahoma to see her daughter. Her book Always Westward provides information on a whole new branch of the family. It was also great to meet two of my cousins who live right here in Oklahoma! (Well okay, they are eighth cousins twice removed) Philip Sears in Oklahoma City and Pamela Sears Shelburne in Wilson reminded me how easy it is to establish a connection with a complete "stranger" just because of family kinship. Sears, ME is named after number 519. This detail confirmed from the Stephen Phillips Library, Penobscot Memorial Museum. David Sears was a large landowner and philanthropist.

Sears, MI is a very small town and the nearest public library is Ewart, MI. Hopefully a letter to them will generate a response.

In 1810 he was living at Armenia, Dutchess co, but moved almost immediately to 79 Chapel st. In 1814 Lemuel and David **Skidmore** are partners in an ironmongery at 167 Washington st.

This did not last long, however, and in 1820 David Skidmore is back at Armenia. In 1830 he is enumerated at Northeast Township, Dutchess co.

On 5 May 825 David and Reny **Skidmore** of Northeast twp, Dutchess co, gave a deed for land there. They returned a deed from Redding, Fairfield co, CT, on 14 Jan 1836 selling land on West Mountain in Dutchess co for \$3300. They are enumerated in 1850 at Danbury; David is 75, Azzenath is 73, and Eliza, their only daughter, is 43.

Ibid p 51, 53; Though no certain record has been found of Jonah and Lois **Fuller** in MI, whither several of their children migrated (Moses, Gaius, Emeline, Dexter, Jonah, Sarah and possibly Charles), two notes exist indicating that they accompanied their children. First, there is the statement in the obituary of their son Jonah that "In 1836, when about fifteen years of age, his parents moved to this state [MI] and settled in the township of Webster, Washtenaw co, then an almost unbroken wilderness." [57-Undated obituary appearing in an unnamed newspaper of Corunna, MI, giving the death of Jonah **Fuller, Jr**, as having occurred on 31 May 1878, photocopy supplied by Leo E Smith of Tucson, AZ, with letter 16 Apr 1988.] Second there is an incomplete statement in the Sears genealogy that "A dau [of Rowland] m. --- **Fuller** of Ann Arbor, MI. Since they would have been about sixty years of age in 1836, when Gaius, Moses, and the younger Jonah settled there, [59-Ellis, pp 269, 338; History of Shiawassee co, MI, p 138] they were not physically beyond undertaking the resettlement, and there is no death record for either Jonah or Lois in Ashfield VR. Further, the 1840 MI census for Livingston co lists the household of Jonah's son Moses **Fuller** as consisting of one male 30-40; one male 60-70; one female 20-30; and one female 50-60. The two older people shown here could be Jonah and Lois **Fuller**, though Lois would have been sixty-three in that year, hence incorrectly included in the 50-60 category. It is equally possible, of course, that the elderly man and woman are parents of Moses **Fuller's** wife. These fragmentary data add weight to the probability of the elder **Fullers** having undertaken the long pioneering trek to the opening Michigan promise. In 1978 George Hessel **McEwan** of Escanaba, MI, a great-grandson of George and Sarah (Fuller) **McEwen**, found among family papers the following list entitled "Grandmother's family" in the handwriting of his father George Fuller **McEwen**. The handwriting of the list itself was unknown to George Hessel **McEwen**.

In 1837, Mr. Sears, in company with J.W. Spencer, Calvin Ainsworth, and Spencer M. White, commenced building the first dam across the river between Rock Island and the Illinois shore.

In the fall of 1841, they erected a two-story saw-mill, and placed on the upper floor a run of burrs, for the accommodation of the neighboring farmers, the nearest flour-mill at that time being one hundred miles distant.

Thomas Patterson supervised the work as millwright, and Jona.

Huntoon dressed and fitted the stones.

In 1843, the company built the "big mill," at a cost of some \$30,000; it was a four-run mill, and the machinery the best that could be procured at that period.

Mr. Sears was noted for his readiness to adopt improved appliances for the simplification and lightening of labor. He brought to Moline the first rotary saw used in the Mississippi valley above St. Louis, thereby incurring the transient displeasure of his employees who looked upon it as an encroachment on their rights. By an arrangement with his partners, he completed the new structure with his own funds, his right to the water power being made for a term of years. He controlled the mill and its business until 1848, shipping its products to St. Louis and lower Mississippi river points.

About 1843, Mr. Sears in company with Charles Atkinson, laid out and plotted the town of Moline and its "Island City" subdivision, which consisted of a tract of thirty-seven acres, on the upper end of Rock Island, then held as a military reserve.

This tract he secured the right from Congress to enter at \$1.25 per acre, the privilege being granted him in consideration of the benefits to navigation which had accrued from the building of the dam on the Illinois side. Mr. Sears established a foundry, erected a store and other buildings in Moline, and thereafter for years had a hand in the advancement of every project which had the material improvement of the town for its aim.

In 1845, he built a saw-mill, and in 1859, a three-run flour-mill on Benham's Island, a narrow strip of land lying contiguous to Rock Island on the north, thereby developing a water power between the two islands. He constructed a steamboat landing below the mill, erected a house and other buildings on the main land, and when in 1865, the government took possession of the island for the purpose of a National arsenal and armory, the commission awarded him \$145,175 for his property and improvements.

In 1855, Mr. Sears purchased one-fourth of the present milling site of Minneapolis, (one-fourth of forty-nine acres, and one-fourth of the water power,) which he sold to the late Gov. C.C. Washburn for \$4,000, and in doing so made a great mistake, as he frequently remarked, and as events subsequently proved. He at the same time built a saw-mill and furniture factory on Lake Minnetonka, which with a bridge contract was the end of his building operations until after the war.

In August, 1861, he enlisted in 22d Illinois Regiment, and served honorably as Quartermaster for three years. In 1867, he built the fine 300-barrel mill at Sears, now operated by his sons, David, William and George, and in 1870, a flour-mill at Cleveland, Mo., and another at Linden in 1873.

In 1875, he went to Tama City, Iowa, erected a large mill, and two years later dug a canal, put in a dam and otherwise improved the water power at Ottumka.

In 1880, he constructed water-works at Red Oak, Iowa, and the following year performed a like work at Joplin, Mo. Mr. Sears was a man of sterling principles. Honest in all his dealings, he was respected by all with whom he had business relations. Liberal to an extreme, none ever asked his charity, who did not receive what he could afford to give. He was a strong advocate of temperance, and practised what he preached. Up to within a few moments of his death, he seemed to be in the enjoyment of good health, in his 80th year, apparently as hale and hearty as at any period of his life. The history of his life is a record of good deeds, and worthy of emulation.

From the Jefferson Co Union Lowell C **Sears**, one of the oldest and most respected residents of Rome, this county, died in his home in that place early on Monday morning, 31 May 1909, aged 76 years and 18 days. Mr **Sears** was for many years a Justice of the Peace in Rome. He was born in Comedian, Oneida co, NY, 13 may 1833, and ten years later came to WI with his parents, who were descendants of Richard **Sears**, one of the Puritans who founded Salem, MA. Since coming to WI, he has always been a resident of the town of Sullivan. He was married 5 Feb 1857, to Catherine **Bornheimer**, and to them were born six daughters, five of whom survive him. In his home he was ever cheerful, kind and indulgent. He was never known to lose his temper or speak an unkind word. For years he has devoted himself entirely to the care of his wife whose failing health was a great source of anxiety to him. Since her death last June, he has never awakened to his former interest in public affairs, but seemed to feel that his life's work was done, and waited patiently for the time to come when he should be called to join her. Since April 16, he has been unable to leave the house, suffering with dropsy caused by heart trouble. He served his country during the last two years of the Civil War, having discharged as Corporal from Co A, 1st WI Heavy Artillery.

We quote from the **Sears**' Genealogy the inscription on the **Sears** Monument in

Yarmouth, MA:

"Worth is better than wealth,

Goodness greater than nobility,

Excellence brighter than distinction."

"This," said one of his daughters, "seems to state clearly father's principles." He was a member of the IOOF and an attendant often at their lodge. He also belonged to the MWA. The GAR of which he was a member, will have charge of the funeral Thursday, 3 June, at 2:00 PM at Rome, WI. He will be laid to rest beside his wife and father in Crowder Cemetery, north of the village of Rome.

Eric Palmer-From Michigan's HEARTLAND 1900-1918 by Forrest **Meek** Log schoolhouses were not unheard of in Clare County, even back in the 1870's, but most were of "frame construction." Sheridan had one log school on Section 35, and Grant had one on Section 21, but beyond this, they were scarce. The reason is that the county had lots of sawmills in the early days, and it was easier to build with lumber. After Meredith was dissolved as an incorporated town in 1899, the permanent population had re-located itself onto that fertile farmland there was in the township. A few families began farming in section 31, so a schoolhouse was required. Lyman **Sears**, the Harrison Jeweler, and Charlie **Butts** headed up a "bee" which built a log school house in 1900. The cracks between the logs were chinked with chips, then plastered and white washed. Two windows were on the north and south sides. Inside, the floors had wide, rough planking and a teacher's desk which had been nailed together from wide boards. Student's desks were commercially manufactured but the ones purchased were all for older children. The wee ones had trouble climbing onto their seats. The school itself was scheduled to be established in Section 32, but the old railroad grade cut west of there in Section 31, so one acre of land on a small knoll just over the line was selected as the site, in order to make use of the Meredith railroad grade. The children climbed wooden steps to get to the boarded-in school yard. A plank was fastened onto the top of the fence, and in nice weather, the children clambered up on it to eat their lunches. On the school property was an abandoned cook stove, left there by the lumbermen. The boys rigged it for operation, then covered it with boughs of sumac for a clubhouse effect. A neighbor boy who didn't attend school came over before recess and started a fire so that the children could cook food brought from home. Eggs and potatoes baked in ashes were the normal fare. Memories of those burned potatoes were selective, and the pupils of the log schoolhouse remembered the delicious times they had in their "wig-wam" as they called it.

Six children were born to this union: Frank and George preceded their mother in death and three sons, Harry, Harold and Charles reside at Clawson, and one daughter, Ethel **Reeder** at Spokane, WA. Following the death of her husband about twenty five years ago, Mrs **Sears** moved with her son, George, to Clawson and has since made her home there. She passed from this life Tuesday 9 Apr, at the age of eighty-one years, two months, four days, leaving, besides her four children, twelve grandchildren and four great-grandchildren, and a wide circle of friends. *** Sleep, dear soul, you have earned your rest, So now lay your head on your Master's breast. Prayer services will be held at 9 a.m. Tuesday at the funeral home and requiem mass at 9:30 a.m. in the Guardian Angels Church, Clawson. Burial will be in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery. Judge **Sears** had suffered from the heart condition for past months and was under a physician's care. When the condition grew worse, in recent weeks he re-entered the hospital. Judge **Sears** was a barber by trade. Because his doctor ordered him to "relax," he and his brother, Charles L retired from barbering May 1. The brothers had been partners in the business since 1926. Their first shop was located at 25 S Main, but later moved into the bank building. Then in 1951 the brothers opened their last shop at 302 S Main. He was born on 9 Oct 1891 in Harrison, MI,(may have been Ontario, Canada) the son of the late Lyman and Catherine (Darling) **Sears**. He moved to Clawson in 1926. For 16 years preceding the time he lived in St Ignace where he and the former Della **Daniels**, a native of St Ignace were married. Judge **Sears** helped draft the present city charter as a member of the charter commission in 1940. He became the city's only justice upon Clawson's incorporation that year. He was re-elected in 1943, 47 and 51. Judge **Sears** was active in Clawson baseball in former years. Eric Palmer-Daily Tribune first half of 1952 by Al Koski:Now that the **Sears** brothers have retired from barbering in Clawson, they won't mind not cutting hair anymore, but they sure will miss the daily visit with their friends. The brothers, Harold R, age 61, and Charles L., 52, hung up their clippers Thursday night. This morning they handed over the key to their shop at 302 S Main to new owner, Robert **Cranson**, 202 Woodlawn, Royal Oak. For the last 29 years, "Charlie" and "The Judge" have snipped and shaved customers - most of whom lived in Clawson and Troy township. Their many years in Clawson earned them the title of being one of the city's oldest businesses. There used to be three barbering **Sears** brothers. But brother Harry, the oldest, died in 1943. It was through Harry that "Charlie" and "The Judge" took up the trade. In 1908 Harry started a shop in Wolverine, MI. As Charlie and The Judge grew up, Harry taught them the trade. The younger brothers served their apprenticeship at the expense of lumberjacks and mill workers in Wolverine. It was 29 years ago today that Charlie opened his first shop at 25 S Main. In the following year, Harry moved from Wolverine and joined Charlie in business. The Judge who had been up in St Ignace for 16 years moved to Clawson and the three finally were partners in 1926. The shop moved that year to the Bank building on the corner of Fourteen-Mile and Main, where it remained until 1951 when the new shop was built. Harold has been called "The Judge" since 1940 when he was elected justice of the peace as the city incorporated. "The Judge" recently suffered a heart attack and was ordered to take it easy by his doctor. That's one of the reasons why the brothers sold out. "Now I just intend to relax and devote more time to my Justice duties," said Harold. "I'll do what work I have around the house but that will be all." "Charlie" plans to move to his 116 acre farm in Wolverine. The Sturgeon river flows at the front door of his farm house. "I'll just sit on the door step, drop my fishing line and just fish," he said. Neither has much complaint against barbering as a career. Charlie is a little sorry because he "was born 30 years too soon. To really get the good out of barbering now is the time to start, he remarked. "Now shorter hours and higher haircut prices make the business more lucrative." "Why, we used to open at 7 a.m. and close anywhere up to 2 o'clock in the morning," chimed in the Judge. "It was hard on your feet." The only thing that has irked the brothers was the customer who wanted a certain type of haircut when "he's got a head that doesn't fit the haircut." The brothers look back on days when all hair was cut with scissors and clippers were never used. Then there was the time when men wore no sideburns and hair could be cut quicker. The brothers marvel at Clawson's growth. They remember old dirt streets and scattered farms, and when the old interurban cars stopped right in front of their shop door. Both are grandfathers. Charlie has four grandchildren and Harold five. Charlie lived above the shop since it was built but the Judge owns a modest home at 263 Bauman, Clawson.

John and Dorcas sold land in T42, R30 to Joel W **Sears** on 21 Mar 1845[38-Bates co Deed Record Book A, p 7]. Franklin had sold land in the same township and range to John on 19 Feb 1842. They arrived in CA in 1845 with the **Grigsby-Ide** party and was a blacksmith at Sonoma. Dorcas gave the cloth for the original Bear Flag.

In "Mariano Guadalupe Vallejo," George **Tays** told of 33 Napa Valley horsemen who, on 13 Jun 1846, rode to Sonoma from Sacramento led by Ezekiel **Merritt**. Surrounding Vallejo's house and drinking brandy, they refused to live under the government of Castro and Pico. William **Scott**, John **Sears**, Oliver **Beaulieu**, and others began shouting "let us loot." Dr Robert **Sample**, backed by John **Grigsby** and Andrew **Kelsey**, threatened to shoot the first who disgraced the expedition. (William Brown **Ide** and Granville **Swift** were also present.) **Vallejo** withdrew from public affairs[39-CA Hist Soc Quart, Vol 17, p220]. **Sears**, Capt, Co D, CA Bn had a Feather River claim in 1848[40-Pioneer Register and Index, p 322].

In a **Beasley** and **Cooper** account book, Blue Wing, Sonoma, 2 Feb 1848, John **Sears** charged 40 pounds flour, \$2, and two glasses liquor, paid 25 cents[41-CA State Hist Soc Library].

On 12 Apr 1848, James and Ephraim **Prigmore** paid \$200 for a Sonoma lot. On 2 Sep 1869 James and Mary **Prigmore**, of Humboldt co, CA, deeded Lot 523 in Sonoma to Israel **Brockman**. James had bought it on 28 Jun 1851 from the town.

On 3 Feb 1848 John and Dorcas **Sears** and James and Mary **Prigmore**, for \$142, conveyed to William W **Scott** Lot 35, Sonoma, CA beside L W **Boggs** on the public square.

On 14 Nov 1850, Sacramento, CA census, #964, #1015 John **Sears**, 39 (or 33),"dairy Vt", Darkus, 31, PA, Elizabeth J, 13, Mary 10, Jas B, 8, Frances A, 7, (all b MO), Jos, 4, CA, and Mathew **Thompson**, 24, laborer, England, and John **Smith**, 20, NY.

In the Sacramento, CA census taken by John F **Madden**, Aug 1852, Dorcas **Sears**, 38, PA, from MO, Elizabeth, 15, TN, Mary E, 12, James, 10, Frances, 8,(all b MO), Joseph, 5, CA, Sonoma. Sharon **Peart** says John was killed by Indians near Marysville, CA. Dorcas died a few years later.

BIRTH-DEATH: SEARS NOTES; 1782-1890; June Rayfield Welch, Dallas, TX; p 14; Married his first cousin, Margaret **Swift**, sister of Granville **Swift**-Franklin's partner. He was a Cass co, MO juror in 1842.

On 22 Apr 1844, when leaving for OR, Franklin gave power of attorney to JBS. He went with McMahon party to CA in 1845 and was at Sutter's Fort when gold was discovered. In Mar 1846 he was nearly killed in a fall from a horse. Recovering, with Fremont in 1846 he served at S. Pascual under **Gillespie** in Stockton's campaign. His battalion captured Los Angeles. After the war Franklin went to the mines, and in 1848 he took out much gold near Bidwell's bar.

"The Vallejo family, Franklin **Sears** of Sears Point. had their Indians[43-The People of the Pueblo, p 18]."

"Among the heroes (who at the battle of San Pasquale fought beside Gen **Kearney's** forces) were Granville P **Swift** and his relatives Franklin and John **Sears**, the latter husband of the emigrant woman who gave the white cloth for the Bear Flag. Franklin was in the thick of the fight and in after years showed his buckskin shirt riddled with seven bullets. Granville P **Swift** was captain of Co C, CA Battalion. These men and Maj Jacob **Snyder** were all closely identified with Fremont's campaign... Franklin **Sears** gave his daughter in marriage to Maj **Snyder**[44-Ibid, p 125]."

"Granville **Swift's** sister, Margaret, married Franklin **Sears**, hero of San Pasquale and brother of John **Sears**, whose wife had given the white homespun material for the Bear Flag. In 1851 while the former partners in adventure were stock raising in Colusa co, Franklin **Sears** and Margaret **Swift** were wed. They decided to come to Sonoma Valley and make their home on a 600-acre ranch which had been purchased on Sonoma Creek. There they built a little house of hand-hewn redwood, still standing after eighty years, near the more pretentious home of their daughter, Rachael **Sears Snyder**. Mrs Franklin **Sears** died in Sonoma in 1886 but Franklin... continued to live until Dec 1904."

Jacob R **Snyder**, a veteran of the Mexican War, had been Surveyor General, was assistant treasurer under President Franklin **Pierce** in 1853. It was his idea to include the grizzly bear on the seal of CA[45-Ibid, pp219-220].

"For many generations the **Sears** family has been numbered among the pioneers of various localities in the Union, on the paternal side being Tennesseans, and on the maternal residents of the 'Dark and bloody ground.'" He came out of the war with a saber wound above his heart. He had 600 or 700 acres and a winery with storage for 150,000 gallons. "During the '40s Mr **Sears**... in partnership with Capt G P **Swift**, his brother in law, built the old stone corral where they had several thousand head of cattle." Later they had 15,000 acres at Sears Point. he had started as a hunter at Sutter's Fort. He and a partner, **Gibson**, struck it rich. "... the red material used in the original Bear Flag was made from the petticoat of Mrs John **Sears**, a sister in law of Franklin **Sears**[46-Historical and Biographical Record, p 314]."

James **Clyman** wrote in his diary that in Siskiyou Co, "Some of our advance pursued a male and a female native. The male made his escape. The female was taken and her horse taken from her (Mr **Sears** and Mr **Owens**)[47-CA Hist Soc Quarterly, Vol V, 1926, pp 117,120]." "Some Indians came up with the rear of our party and Mr **Sears** shot two of them." 1 Jul 1845.

"4 Jul 1845- On this our national holiday a brutal and disgraceful occurrence took place. Some Indians were seen across the river and Mr **Sears** proposed to kill one of them single-handed if his comrades would keep him covered with their guns. They agreed and he started out armed only with his bowie knife. After swimming across he encountered an Indian who had been firing at him from behind a rock without effect. They grappled and **Sears** stabbed his man to death and then returned safe and sound across the river. I was so disgusted with this affair at the time that I did not enter it in my notes[48-Ian **Petroff's** abstract of **Clyman's** notebook. Ms Bancroft Library. Franklin **Sears** said this happened at Red Bluff]."

J A **Sutter's** list of immigrants who arrived on 10 Jul 1845 contained 39 men, a widow, and 3 children. With Capt Samuel Green **McMahon** were James **Clyman**, Franklin **Sears**, blacksmith, and Thomas, Ed, Henry, James and **John Owens**. Alcalde **Sutter** could grant passports[49-CA Hist Soc Quarterly, Vol V, p 125. Franklin's biography and Jacob **Snyder's** diary appear in The Quarterly of the Society of CA Pioneers, Vol 8, No 4, Dec 1931].

A letter from James G **Bleak** quoted another, dated 11 Jan 1878, from Los Angeles in which Wm L **Todd** wrote that at Sonoma in 1846 those appointed to design a flag were Granville P **Swift**, Peter **Storm**, Henry L **Ford** and **Todd**. He said, "... we procured in the house where we made our headquarters, a piece of new unbleached cotton domestic, not quite a yard wide, with strips of red flannel about four inches wide, furnished by Mrs John **Sears**, on the lower side of the canvas. On the upper left hand corner was a star, and in the center was the image made to represent a grizzly bear passant, so common in this country at the time[50-History of Sonoma Co, San Francisco: Alley, Bowen & Co, 1880, pp 104-6]." The Bear Flag was replaced by the American flag 9 Jul 1846. This description of Granville **Swift** was provided by William **Baldridge**:[51-Henry L **Ford**, "Bear Flag Lieutenant," CA Hist Soc Quarterly, Vol XXIX, No 2, Jun 1950, p 134].

"Although his father was a man of wealth, **Granville's** education was much neglected, being able only to read and write indifferently, which was partially his own fault, being passionately fond of a hunter's life for which he was admirably adapted. he was fair complexioned, six feet one inch in height, very erect and symmetrical, and of great endurance and undoubted bravery. It is well known that he was the best shot, and could load and fire with greater rapidity than any man on the Pacific Coast."

Among those receiving land grants under 1847 to 1855 acts were Pvt Franklin **Sears**, Capt **Swift** Co, CA Vols, Mexican War, Napa co, and Pvt Frank Irving **Sears**, Capt **Lewis'** Co, First Regt IN Vols, Mexican War, land in Trinity co, CA[52- National Gen Soc Quarterly, Sep 1983, p 229].

In 1861 Franklin returned to Sonoma, where he farmed and ranched 270 acres and raised grapes and operated a winery on 30 acres[53-Sonoma Co, p 299].

William **Crawford** gave land for Altona, which was a trading post in 1860. The first business was established by a **Scroggins**. George **Sears** owned a drug store[56-Altona Baptist Church Centennial program, 1969] In 180 Deer Creek twp, Bates co, MO census, George, 31, lived with his mother and Elias and was worth \$5,000. His mother had \$3,000. Joined Confederate Army in AR. After the war he lived ten miles from Clinton, MO. he moved in 1867 to Bates co, where in the 1870 Grand River twp census, George, 37, had \$6,400 realty, \$1,500 personalty, Priscilla, was 27, born in MO. Elias, 54, was born in KY, and Jame, 75, TN; neither was literate. George stated:[57-Old Settlers' History of Bates co, MO, Amsterdam, MO: Tathwell and Maxey, 1900]. "my parents came from KY to Saline co, MO, in the year of 1827. I was born in Saline co, 6 Nov 1831. My parents came to Bates co, (then called Vernon co) in the fall of 1838 and settled on the farm known as the Richey farm, one-half mile northeast of where Altona now is. At that time there was not more than five or six families in that settlement. A M **Trueman** and J **Coffman** are all the names I can now remember. "My father broke the first prairie that was broke in that settlement in the spring of 1839. In the fall of 1838 he built a double log house of hewn logs and men came from Clinton, Harrisonville and Warrensburg to help raise it. It was a two story and was a fine house in that day and time. "We then had no school house nearer than Clinton, 25 miles away and no churches to attend on Sunday, therefore we usually spent Sunday at some of the many Indian camps on the creek. "About the second year we were there the county began settling up slowly, and a school house was built about two and a half miles from our house. The first school was a three months term taught by a Mr **Knuckles**. "Among those who came about that time were William **Swift**, Hiram **Edwards**, Robert **Davis**, Joe and Oscar **Reeder**, Dave **Newland** and Mose **Strong**. "At that time we went to Lexington to mill; we would take ox teams and wagons and take our corn, deer skins and venison and trade them for groceries. We would sometimes take as much as 100 bushels of corn at a time, and when we got our meal home we would put it in large boxes and put limestone rock in it to keep it from becoming old and musty before it was used. "When I was about ten years old my father sent me to Johnstown (then called

Hardscrabble). twelve miles distant, to get Dr **Thornton** for a neighbor by the name of **Johnson**, and, as I had never seen a doctor, I wondered all the way down there what a doctor looked like. "We lived in four counties - and did not move once - it was first Van Buren, then Cass, then Vernon and now Bates. "At that time this country was full of deer and turkey and some elk. The elk came from the west and went down in Saline co to the salt pond; my father and others would follow and kill them. I have eaten their meat, but never saw one alive. At that time power and lead were so high and hard to get, and turkeys were so plentiful, that we rarely ever shot at a turkey and would not shoot at a deer, except at short range and when sure of a dead shot. "In the winter of 1848-49 the whole face of the earth was covered with sleet about eighteen inches thick and slick as glass. The whole country was then alive with deer and wolves, and we could go out with sticks and clubs and find them, and the more they were scared the less they could run, and they were at our mercy.

"The first morning after the sleet fell I killed seven deer in the forenoon; my father finally made us stop killing deer, but we killed hundreds of wolves with sticks and clubs. "I hunted deer for about thirty years and I believe I have killed 1,000 deer in sight of where Altona now is. "We attended court at Harrisonville until the county was changed to Vernon, and then Pappinsville was the county seat.

"I do not remember much about the hanging of Nottingham, but I remember I would have gone to see him hanged if it had not been that I had seen a man by the name of Horton hanged at Clinton for wife murder and I did not want to see another.

"In 1849 my father owned 1,000 acres of land in and around where Altona now is. He had paid \$1.25 per acre for it, and my brother, Frank, who had gone to CA in 1844, and was at Sutter's Fort when gold was first discovered, wrote father not to fool with his land, but to get an outfit and come right on; so father sold his whole tract to Col William **Crawford**, for \$1.61 per acre, and started with two four-mule teams and two ox teams and got as far as Fort Kearney, where he died of cholera. My mother, two sisters and myself came back to where Altona now is, and we lived in that vicinity until Oct 1861. I then went to Hempstead co, AR, and went in the army and stayed all through the war.

"On the second day of Mar 1862 I was married to Miss Precila **Scroggins**. In 1866 I came back to Henry co, about 10 miles from Clinton; in 1867 I bought the **Shaw** farm on Peter creek, and moved to it, in Bates co. That fall the wolves would come and kill our pigs and geese and scratch on the door and try to get in.

"Flour was then worth \$5.00 per 100 pounds, and we had to go to Warrensburg after it; butter was 25 cents per pound; eggs 20 cents per dozen in the summer; hens \$4.00 a dozen; calicoes 15 cents per yard; thread 10 cents per spool. "In an early day this country was a perfect paradise, the prairie was one vast flower bed, most beautiful to behold; the woods were full of wild bees and in the later part of the summer we would cut bee trees and get honey for winter use. And as barrels and other vessels were very scarce, we would cut large linn and hackberry trees, split the logs open and hew out huge troughs to store away our honey in.

"The people did not possess wealth, but they were healthy, happy and contented.

"Of the counties included in General Order No 11, 25 Aug 1863, Bates was the only one entirely depopulated. Not even a military station was reserved there. "As a result of the Ewing order bates co once again became a trackless wilderness. The population of 6,000 went to 0."
