Silas Sears removed from Schoharie, N. Y., to Orwell, Pa., his residence was near the Presbyterian Church, and he was buried close by. His will dated Feb. 20, 1830, was proved April 30, 1830, and mentions wife Sally, and daus. Mary Ann, Betsy Gray, Elly and Emeline.
