

Introduction

The following pages list data for all known family members as of 8th December 2020.

Each immediate family is presented in their own section that contains a graphical family tree as well as a description with information about each referenced person and their children. The child section provides information about the children of the preceding couple. When a child has offspring of their own this is presented in a separate family section for that child. In this case a '+' is used to denote that an individual will appear later in the book as a parent with his/her own children and there is a link to the appropriate family reference number. For children with partners but no offspring the partner data is given with the reference family. Roman numerals, followed by a period, are used to indicate the birth order.

In the chapter titled "Families of the Starting Person" the ancestors of Reuben Sears are presented in a kind of enhanced Pedigree Chart which displays the graphic representation of their direct-line ancestors and the children of the couple. This chapter contains information about the couple whose relatives are listed in the later chapters.

The chapter titled "Families of his Ancestors" provides details (as known as of the publication date) for the relatives of Reuben Sears. There is a chapter for each generation. Relatives are listed in the order of the nearness of their relationship.

Sources for the information provided are given in the footnotes.

This document reports the details of 812 individuals, of whom 389 are male and 414 are female. The sex of 9 individuals is unknown. Of the 548 individuals with recorded birth and death dates, the average lifespan was 55.7 years. Of these, 272 males averaged 56.67 years, and 271 females averaged 55.46 years. The longest living male was Charles Hall Sears (1856–1958), who died aged 101. The longest living female was Mary Elizabeth Polly Sears (1863–1969), who died aged 105.

In her 1957 hit "Old Cape Cod," Patti Page extols the virtues of our salty air, but how often do we think about the value salt has had here, and its once vital role in the commercial fishing industry?

From the early days of the Massachusetts Bay Colony salt was critical for ensuring the stability of offshore catches, which in turn drove the economy.

"Plentiful quantities were required to preserve the fish caught by vessels that would go out to the Grand Banks for months at time," says Yarmouth's Bob Kelley, a tenth generation Cape Codder, member of the Dennis Historical Society and vice president of Yarmouth Historical Society. "They would catch the fish, gut them and pack them with salt before throwing them in the hold. An average 40-ton schooner would use 700 bushels of salt a year."

New England's salt supply was originally imported from England and Mediterranean countries, and eventually the British Caribbean Islands, which developed "works" to evaporate seawater and extract the valuable mineral.

"Salt making by solar evaporation really began here in 1775," says Kelley. "The resource of salt water had always been here, but the colonists didn't have the ability to extract it profitably."

The cost of wood fuel needed to boil ocean water to distill salt was the problem.

"It cost more to burn the fires to get the salt than the salt was worth," says Kelley.

It was cheaper to import through England's vast network of colonies, territories and commodity exchanges.

But by 1775, the American colonies and England were on the brink of war, so the British government issued a much-despised salt tax and other interdictions that placed embargoes on imported goods and prohibited colonists from fishing off Nova Scotia.

"That is really what started things off," says Kelley. "The king intended to starve them into submission, so it inspired Capt. John Sears and others to begin this process."

In the Quivet Neck section of what was then Yarmouth (now Dennis), Sears built a 10-foot by 100-foot shallow wooden container, and used buckets to fill it with seawater, which then evaporated in the sun. Solid salt remained, but not much: In 1776, the first full year of production, Sears' salt vat only produced eight bushels of salt.

Sears, who had spent most of his life as a professional sea captain, caulked and improved his salt works and managed to increase production to 30 bushels the following year. Local neighbors were amused by "Sears' Folly," until November of 1778, when Sears salvaged a bilge pump from the wreck of the HMS Somerset III, a British man-o-war that sank off Provincetown (and had figured largely in the ongoing Revolutionary War.)

Sears put the recovered pump to work drawing seawater into the vat. His cousin Reuben Sears, a woodworker who had helped Sears with building the salt works, conceived of a rolling cover for the vat, which protected the seawater from being diluted when it rained.

"It became such an important industry in town," says Kelley, "that when it was about to rain they would let school out so all the children could go to the salt works to help roll out the cover."

When Nathaniel Freeman of Harwich suggested that Sears use a wind-driven pump for raising the water, the business flourished. These "pump mills" allowed cisterns beneath the windmills to capture thousands of gallons of water, which was then dispersed via wooden aqueducts into the vats, at about a foot deep.

Sears obtained a patent for his invention in 1799, which he in turn granted to others, including Nathaniel Freeman, as a thank-you for his wind pump contribution.

"In that way," says Kelley, "Freeman ended up with the rights to salt works in Harwich, Orleans and Chatham."

Sears also deeded a large portion of his salt works in perpetuity to his sister Deborah Sears' husband Christopher Crowell, who was his financier. "Sears gave back to a lot of people who helped him," says Kelley.

By the early 1800s much of the Cape was operating successful salt works, with around 800 vat systems on the peninsula creating salt. And they were doing it year round. Summer was the season to produce common salt, but when the salt water became too cold in winter months, sodium sulphate (known as Glauber salt) would form instead. Cape Cod salt makers would sell their winter Glauber salt for other uses, including soap and dyes for textiles.

Sears' design was not the only schematic for salt production.

"Hattil Killey invented one called 'crane works' which was like a checkerboard," says Kelley, "with two covers connected diagonally with a fulcrum in the center and a metal rod into the ground. I believe it was an improved version, but the Sears model was less expensive to set up."

Other Killeys, including brothers Seth and Zeno, worked with Abiel Akin and Isiah Crowell (himself a nephew of John Sears) to bring salt works to the Bass River area of Yarmouth.

"The works were located around the area where Ship Shops is now and extended above Main Street, half way up to Long Pond." says Kelley. "My great, great grandfather David Kelley was still producing salt in Bass River village from 1885 through 1890. It was a local industry that lasted at least 100 years."

Salt's economic importance to Cape Cod was reflected in the ongoing battles between the northern industrial states and the rural south. The US government responded with varying levels of tariffs and embargoes, see-sawing between benefitting the North or placating the South. There were salt duties, subsidies, and the 1828 "Tariff of Abominations" (so called by the South) which was implemented to protect northern industry by taxing imported goods. By 1846, the pendulum had swung back again and the Walker Tariff reduced the rates of import duties.

"It was really the tariffs and the embargoes that regulated whether you could make a profit or not in producing salt," says Kelley.

While various fluctuations on imports and exports wounded the industry, the discovery of salt deposits in upstate New York and ultimately the invention of refrigeration ended the salt works era on Cape Cod.

You can still relish local salt, but now as a cooking seasoning rather than a wholesale preservative. Businesses such as 1830 Sea Salt, Cape Cod Saltworks and the Wellfleet Sea Salt Company make it possible for you to sprinkle some locally harvested salt onto a nice filet, without needing to pack it into a barrel.




Figure 3: SPM156





Figure 4: SPM157







Figure 6: 5556a.jpg




Figure 7: U.S., Sons of the American Revolution Membership Applications, 1889-1970




Figure 10: SPM92





Figure 11: SPM93







Figure 13: 3603 Cape 723Margery(52).jpg




Figure 19: SPM161




Figure 18: SPM160




Figure 20: SPM158





Figure 21: SPM158A




Figure 23: SPM160




Figure 24: SPM161





Figure 25: SPM159





Figure 28: SPM241




Figure 30: SPM244





Figure 31: SPM244





of the marriage intentions of Miss Hannah M. Hopkins (21 Nov 1829, per the Brewster VR). I find the Miss significant because on the same and adjacent pages of the Brewster VR there are several marriage intentions where the spouse is listed as Mrs. indicating that she was previously married. This is not the case with Orin Sears and Hannah Hopkins. Samuel May's Sears genealogy lists Hannah Hopkins, born in Provincetown, 18 Sep 1808. This date is consistent with the dates for the spouse of Orin Sears in several US censuses, e.g., 1850 and 1880, but it is not consistent with Hannah Mayo Nickerson being the spouse of Orin Sears, as she was married to Zoheth Hopkins, and bore a child in 1817, at the age of nine? As to the second Hannah Hopkins, the Hingham Vital Records record the death of the spouse of Orin Sears on 30 Mar 1891 as being age 82 years, 6 months, and 12 days, which corresponds exactly with the date of birth of 18 Sep 1808 listed above. It also lists her place of birth as Provincetown, and her parents as () Hopkins and Abigail Atwood. All this is inconsistent with the assumption of Orin's spouse as Hannah Mayo Nickerson. The NEHGR, Vol. 104, Pg. 104, July 1950 lists Hannah M. Hopkins, daughter of Scammon Hopkins and Abigail (Nabby) (), born in Provincetown, 18 Sep 1808, married in Brewster 10 Dec 1829 to Orrin Sears. He removed with his family to Hingham in 1846. These dates are consistent with Samuel May's data. The date of birth on her tombstone, 1808, (Hingham Cemetery Plot E-105-4), is inconsistent with the date of Hannah Mayo Nickerson's marriage date of 1817. With regard to Hannah's middle name (Mayo or Maria?), Samuel May shows one child named Hannah Maria, so the middle name Maria could be likely. My family notes (undocumented) also gives Hannah Marie for Orin's spouse's name. I believe this is a convincing argument for Hannah M. Hopkins, daughter of Scammon and Abigail Hopkins, being the spouse of Orin Sears, rather than Hannah Mayo Nickerson. I would appreciate any comments you might have. 



Figure 32: SPM245







Figure 33: SPM389



The house was built in 1719 for descendants of Richard Sears, who had purchased the property from Alice Bradford on November 23, 1664, for £20. Would you think that the lack of right angles throughout your old house is charming? 2. Would you hate to replace old, bumpy horsehair plaster? Or old, worn fireplace bricks? 3. How about those uneven distressed floorboards? Do you like them that way? 4. Does the house's construction history interest you? On visiting an old house, do you want to see the cellar and attic first? Would you feel proud that the local historical commission so values your house that it prohibits most exterior alterations? 6. Is it OK with you that the main staircase to the second floor is both steep and narrow? 7. Would you value candle burn marks on the paneling over your living room fireplace? 8. Would you be reluctant to cover wide floorboards with carpeting? 9. Are you apt to notice and appreciate details such as wrought-iron door hinges, four-paneled walls, hand-planing marks on exposed corner posts, diamond-paned windows, etc.? 10. Would you like feeling that you're sort of sharing your house with the many generations who have lived there before you? How did you do? "Yes" for all 10? Our own score turned out to be nine out of the 10, which is still probably OK because we truly do love 18th-century houses. (We wouldn't need to see the cellar and attic first.) The "Cape Cod gem" to which we referred on the previous page is on a quiet, secluded seven acres off Route 6A in Brewster, Massachusetts, one of our favorite Cape Cod communities. Besides the 11-room, two-story saltbox, also on the property are a good-size workshop with lots of old tools; an antique barn, which serves as a garage; lovely lawns where sheep and goats once grazed; old trees and stone walls; a rushing brook that's an active annual herring run; and 700 feet of shore frontage on a pond, plus a sleeping shelter with woodstove and cot within a few feet of the water. Sound OK so far? But there's more. Now owned by the town but once part of the property is a 1/3-acre cemetery with a hundred or more old headstones marking various members of the prominent Sears family, who built the house in 1719. They acquired this land in the 1660s from the widow and second wife of

none other than Governor William Bradford, one of the founders of the first permanent English settlement in the Northeast (you know, the folks who sailed over here on the Mayflower in 1620 and hopped onto "the rock" in Plymouth). From the house, it's about a five-minute walk to the cemetery and brook on a wide, grassy, tree-lined path that was once Old County Way, an offshoot of the famous King's Highway back in Colonial days. Look sharp, as we did, and you'll spot a large metal ring embedded in one of the stone walls along the way. We wondered how many hundreds of horses had been hitched there over the span of those early years. To get back to the main house, it has three nice, sunny bedrooms upstairs, plus two bathrooms, while the downstairs features the original parlor plus a large living room created from an 18th-century ell, complete with a huge reproduction Colonial brick fireplace (one of five fireplaces, three working). There's also a dining room, probably once the so-called "borning room" where Colonial babies came into the world; a fully equipped but rather plain kitchen; and several other rooms added to the original 1719 footprint that today comprises about 1,800 square feet. And all the interesting historical features we mentioned in our 10 questions are very much in evidence throughout these 11 rooms -- from the distressed floorboards to the lack of right angles to the candle burn marks over one of the fireplaces. However, we must emphasize that old and relatively unaltered as it is, this house is livable right now. It's heated with oil, it has town water, there's a new septic tank, the appliances in the kitchen and bathrooms are up-to-date, the roof and shingling look to be in fine shape -- in short, you could walk in there tomorrow morning and start living. But it has been unoccupied for a couple of years. The current owner, who lives in Barton, Vermont, has never set foot in the place; he inherited the property from his late wife as part of a complicated series of circumstances. But he has had someone nearby coming in every week to check on things, mow the lawns, do repairs, and so forth. The price? Knowing about properties on Cape Cod, we expected it to be in the millions. But it's only \$899,000. The catch is that not everyone wants to live in an 18th-century house. And, as with so many historic homes along Cape Cod's Route 6A, from Sandwich to Orleans, the Old King's Highway Historical Commission, under the overall jurisdiction of the Compact of Cape Cod Conservation Trusts; Mark H. Robinson, executive director), imposes certain restrictions on both the property (you can't subdivide it, for instance) and the outside of the house itself. To some people, that's a negative. Thus the price is comparatively low. If we were to become the owner, would we want to change anything? Probably not, except, well, the kitchen is a little dark and the ceiling too low. But we could do whatever we wanted as long as it didn't significantly alter the exterior. Obviously, we'd consult with Mark H. Robinson about it, and we're positive he'd be thrilled to know that one of the most historically significant, valuable, and gorgeous properties on the Cape was in good hands once again. 


Figure 35: Brewster's "Ancient Sears Burying Ground" holds 124 family graves, including the unmarked resting place of Richard Sears.




Figure 38: SPM57




Figure 37: sears_burial08full




Figure 46: SPM58




Figure 48: SPM59




Figure 52: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988




Figure 55: SPM89




Figure 56: SPM90






Figure 57: 3383.jpg





Steven Martin and Cynthia Robbins have restored the 1768 David Baker Jr. House at 527 Main St., South Dennis. Martin is a descendant of first settler Richard Sears, giving him deep Dennis roots. "The lovely full Cape house is one of six 1700s south facing houses in South Dennis," Horton said. "As was the early custom, houses were placed to take advantage of the sun coming into their front windows.

David Jr. married Jean Baker in 1767 and built this house the following year, a copy of the house his father David Sr. owned at the intersection of Route 134 and Upper County Road. "Over the years, several other Davids lived here," Horton said. "Most of them were sea captains or mariners."

In the 20th century, this was the summer home of Dr. Vannevar Bush, a scientist, inventor and educator who served as a dean at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and later as president of the Carnegie Institute. "In 1940, President Franklin D. Roosevelt selected Dr. Bush to lead a think tank of 30,000 scientists to develop ideas and inventions in case the U.S. was drawn into WWII," Horton said. 




Figure 60: JohnSearsJr




Figure 63: SPM90




Figure 68: SPM91




Figure 69: SPM91A





Figure 73: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988








Figure 76: SPM94




Figure 77: U.S., Sons of the American Revolution Membership Applications, 1889-1970







Figure 79: SPM81


Figure 80: Mayflower Births and Deaths, Vol. 1 and 2

Figure 82: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988




Figure 83: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988






Figure 84: SPM152








Figure 86: 3773 Cape 713Mehitable(42-).jpg




Figure 87: 3773a.jpg







Figure 88: SPM153







Figure 90: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988



- !S.P. May p.153(No 237) Died of consumption. Capt Sears will be long remembered on Cape Cod in connection with his invention of the process of making salt by solar evaporation.
- ! In 1776, he constructed a vat, one hundred feet long, and ten feet wide. Rafters were fixed over it, and shutters were contrived to move up and down, that the vat might be covered when it rained, and exposed to the sun in fair weather. But the works were leaky, and the first year he obtained but eight bushels of salt.
- ! He was ridiculed by his neighbors, and his invention was styled, "Sears' Folly" ! Capt. Sears persevered, the works were made tight, and the second year thirty bushels of salt were obtained.
- ! In this and the third year the salt water was poured into the vat from buckets a tedious and laborious operation.
- ! In the fourth year he rigged a pump, procured from the wreck of the British man-of-war "Somerset," which had been cast away upon the Cape; it was worked by" hand which was still great labor.
- ! In 1785, at the suggestion of Maj. Nathaniel Freeman of Harwich, Capt. Sears contrived a pump to be worked by wind, thus greatly abridging the labor.
- ! Covers to move on rollers were invented by Reuben Sears, a carpenter of Harwich; and Capt. Sears was further assisted in the improvement of the works by Capt. Wm Crowell, Capt. Christopher Crowell and Capt. Edward Sears of Dennis.
- ! These persons assigned to him their right and title in the invention, he applied for a patent, which he obtained in 1799.
- ! Incidently to this industry, the manufacture of Glauber Salts, once much used in medicine, became an important branch of the business.
- ! Rev Ephraim Briggs of Chatham, a skillful chemist, greatly improved the process of manufacture.
- ! The salt business was for many years one of great value and importance in Barnstable County.
- ! In 1832 there were in the county 1,425,000 feet of vats, producing 358,250 bushels, but in 1834 the industry was checked by the reducito of the duty. The development of the Salt Springs in New York and elsewhere served to make the business unprofitable, and there are now (1887) few works standing and in operation.
- ! Like many other inventive geniuses, Capt Sears had fits of abstraction, and his neighbors gave him the nickname "Sleepy John," which he held till the success of his invention caused it to be diplaced by that of "Salt John."
- ! He once undertook to build an Orrery, and rigged up an old cart-wheel, to the spokes of which he affixed his planets. This was hung up over the door of his shop, in which he used to fasten himself while at work on his hobbies.
- ! One day his wife wishing to enter the shop forced the door, when the contrivance fell upon her, injuring her severely.
- ! When asked what was the matter with her,a neighbor said:"John Sears' earth fell




Figure 96: SPM154






Figure 98: SPM140

Library of Cape Cod History and Genealogy, #52, A Brief Sketch of the Life of George Webb, A Cape Cod Captain in the Revolutionary War. By Josiah Paine, Harwich, Mass. Copyright, 1914, by Charles W. Swift This brave officer who served throughout the Revolutionary war, who participated in seventeen engagements, and who was considered by his superior officers a trusty captain, was a Cape Cod man, and was born in that part of old Yarmouth, now Dennis, June 9, 1740. He was the eldest of the two sons of John and Betsey (Sears) Webb. His father was a mariner who had for some time been connected in some way with the British navy. Some few years after the birth of his youngest son, John, he went on a sea youage and never returned. The sons, George and John, hardly remembered him; but their recollection of him was such as to establish in their minds an opinion of his regular nautical training and his ability as a disciplinarian that was never forgotten. The mother died at the age of 35, in September, 1755, and lies buried in old Winslow burying ground in East Dennis, a stone [p.2] with an inscription marking the place of burial. [There is a stone in the Ancient Sears Cemetery-hmmm.] She was a daughter of John and Priscilla (Freeman) Sears, born about 1720*, and married John Webb, Aug. 23, 1739. In 1760, it appears,

Capt. Webb had his first experience as a soldier in active service. At that time he was not twenty years of age, yet he felt it his patriotic duty to heed the call of the Provincial government for volunteers to re-enforce Gen. Amherst's army now preparing for the final ending of the French control of Canada, and bringing to a close the long war for that end, for which, from its beginning, the Cape towns had furnished many soldiers; so he enlisted to serve in Capt. Thomas West's company, and was mustered in at the North parish, in Harwich, March 8, 1760. Capt. West was a young man then residing in Chatham, and his company was made up mostly by young men of about young Webb's age, recruited in the Cape towns. Capt. West had seen much of martial life. He was at the taking of Cape Breton in 1745, and had served as a corporal nearly a year, in a company against the French and Indians, led by Capt. Peleg West of Tisbury, in 1757. He had also served as a first lieutenant in the company led by Capt. Samuel Knowles of Eastham, in 1758. This company was in Col. Doty's regiment under Gen. Abercrombie, and participated in the disastrous attempt to take Ticonderoga from the French. *The old house occupied by her father was, a few years since, standing in East Dennis, just west of the Brewster lines and southwesterly of the old Sears burying ground in West Brewster. It was built, it is supposed, about the year 1705. [p.3] Capt. Thomas West's company took up its line of march from the public house* of "Widow Howes" in Harwich, April 26, for the rendevous in Worcester by the way of Boston. From Worcester, the company proceeded to the frontier, and joined the "Western Army." Its term of service expired the last of December following, and Capt. West returned to Chatham. But becoming interested in lands in Barrington, Nova Scotia, as a proprietor, he went to that place and setllted upon his land, and there died about the year 1769. He was a fearless, self-reliant man a a good soldier. disbandment of the company, young Webb returned to his home; but of his subsequent life to the beginning of the Revolutionary war, very little is known. It is thought he became engaged in seafaring business, as his brother, John, was a master mariner before his removing to western Massachusetts. The Harwich records show he intended marriage with Ann Sears, Aug. 22, 1761, and that his marriage to her, by Rev. Isaiah Dunster of Harwich, took place October 29 following. He undoubtedly was at this time a resident. In 1771, his name appears as a tax payer in Harwich. His place of residence ws in that part of old Harwich, now Brewster. When the Revolutionary war broke out it found him on the right side, against England, fired with ardent patriotism, ready to *This "public house" was situated in North Harwich on the north side of the way from Chatham to Yarmouth, close to the west side of the Herring river, andhad been known as "Downe's tavern."

[p.4]take the field and fight against England with the same zeal he had fought when a lad of twenty for England in the French and Indian war. By the record it appears his first service in the cause of liberty as an officer was as first lieutenant of the company of coast guards, commanded by Capt. Seth Clark of the North precinct of Harwich. The company numbered about fifty men, who were chiefly residents of the town. It was raised principally to observe the movements of the British war vessels upon the southern coast of the Cape, and in case of any attempt of landing men to oppose it. It was on duty from Jul 1, to December 31, 1775, when it was disbanded, having performed efficient duty. Some of these men afterwards served in the Continental army Early in the year 1776, Lieut. Webb became the first lieutenant of Capt. Peter Harwood's company of light infantry in the Continental army under Washington. In this company he served more than a year, when he was promoted to the captaincy of a company in Col. William Sheperd's regiment of light infantry which was known as the Massachusetts Fourth, ranking from January 1, 1777. While lieutenant in Capt. Harwood's company he participated in several engagements among which were Trenton and Princeton. Capt. Webb's company was composed of young men chiefly enlisted in Barnstable county. Twenty-two of them were enlisted in Harwich

and were mustered by Gen. Joseph Otis of Barnstable, the muster master. Some of the company were enlisted for nine months, some for three years and a few for the war. While in command of his company, Capt. Webb was in many

[p.5] of the battles that gave our arms the victory. He was in Glover's brigade and Sheperd's regiment in the two engagements that preceded the surrender of the army of Burgoyne at Saratoga, Oct. 17, 1777, and was present at the capitulation. He was with Washington and his army in the winter quarters at Valley Forge during the intensely cold winter of 1777-78, which followed Burgoyne's surrender, where he and his men, and other soldiers in the snow covered encampment, spent indeed a trying period. It was surely his winter of discontent, as well as that of Washington andhis army in the encampment. Well could these soldiers - hungry, ragged, shoeless and shivering in their poorly constructed log huts during that rigorous winter - have said with the foremast political writer in America in 1776 when our armies were suffering repeated defeats and gloom hung over the colonies - "These are the times that try men's souls." The encampment at Valley Forge was on the west side of the Schuykill river in Pennsylvania and about twenty miles northwest of Philadelphia. This position for an encampment was taken by Washington for the purpose, says Marshall, "of covering the country of Pennsylvania, protecting the magazines laid up in it and cutting off those supplies to the British in Philadelphia which many of the people were disposed to furnish them." It was "a very strong and commanding piece of ground for the purpose," but bleakly situated for winter quarters. The army entered it from Whitmarsh, a place not far distant, December 11, and at once commenced building huts for occupancy during its stay, the snow

[p.6] was upon the ground, and during the march many of the soldiers left bloody footprints in the snow, they being without shoes. Both Marshall and Thacher give a deplorable condition of the army in this place. During the six months at Valley Forge Capt. Webb's company was not free from sickness and death, nor from diminution in number through expiration of enlistment. The terms of two of his men from Eastham, John Myrick and Amos Doane, who had enlisted for nine months, expired here in midwinter. The former rather than to suffer longer here, upon his discharge, returned to his home, while the latter chose to re-enlist for another nine months, probably on account of sickness, as he was sick in camp about three months "of a fever and the smallpox," all probably the result of innoculation. John Young and Crocker Young, both of old Harwich, in the company, doubtless found resting places here, as they were reported in March as being dead. Haskell Freeman, Watson Freeman and Edward Nickerson, with others, all young men from old Harwich, were in the company, and survived the terrible winter, and had the privilege to be at the battle of Monmouth and Rhode Island the same year and test their brayery. Capt. Webb was with his company in Sheperd's regiment, and Glover's brigade at the battle of Monmouth, Jun 28, 1778, when Washington turned defeat into victory. The day was excessively warm, andhis men suffered intensely from heat and thirst. The day was Sunday and the conflict continued from nine in the morning till darkness. At night the men lay upon their arms on the warm ground expecting a renewal of the fight in the morning, but [p.7] when it dawned there was no British army in sight, and Washington with his army proceeded on to White Plain on the Hudson for headquarters. The day at Monmouth was never forgotten by the old soldiers when telling stories by the fireside of the capture of Burgoyne, and of their stay at Valley Forge. Soon after returning to the Hudson, Capt. Webb's company was sent to Rhode Island, and there under Gen. Sullivan, took part in the battle fought at Quaker Hill, August 29, 1778. In this battle Capt. Webb had two of his men, belonging to old Harwich, severely wounded. They were Haskell Freeman and Watson Freeman. The former was unfit for duty for sometime on the account of his wound, and was given a furlough for recuperation. He was promoted to the lieutenancy, Nov. 26, 1779, but resigned Aug. 24, 1780, on the

account of ill health, due to the wounds he had received at Rhode Island. Capt. Webb ws on duty in Col. Sheperd's regiment at the handing of Maj. John Andre, the spy, Oct. 2, 1780, at tappan, N.Y. With his command, he was in the detachment under Lafayette, sent by General Washington from the main army to strengthen the continental force in Virginia early in the spring of 1781, in protecting that colony from the depredations of Cornwallis's army then centering there. It was in May, following the arrival of the detachment, that he had a brisk and successful skirmish with the enemy while out on an important excursion with his command. The defeat of the enemy by the bravery of Capt. Webb greatly pleased Gen. Lafayette, and he sent to his trust captain a letter*, assuring him that the "successful skirmish" had "afforded" him "the greatest pleasure," and desired him to accept his "best thanks" and convey the same to his company "on this occasion." At other times afterwards, while Lafayette's division ws watching the movements of Cornwallis's detachments, and badgering them at every point about Richmond, Petersburg and places north and south of James river and other points in that part of Virginia, he was sent out on secret service and was equally as successful in good results. When the seige of Yorktown commenced, he held his command in Gen. Lafayette's division, and was given an active part in the intrenchments before the doomed place with his brave men, and was present when it fell and the British army under Cornwallis surrendered. In his company in the trenches before the illfated place, in uniform, with blistered hands, displaying great gallantry, enduring hardship, and daring to follow where her brave captain dared to lead, was the noted heroine, Deborah Sampson of Massachusetts, a new recruit, bearing the name of Robert Shurtliffe, the story of whose life in the sacred cause of liberty has so often been Capt. Webb after the surrender of Cornwallis remained in Yorktown until the middle of November following, when, with his company in the detachment in which he had rendered such important service, returned to the headquarters of Washington's *History of Holden, Mass.

[p.9] on the Hudson, where he was on duty until the middle of January, 1782, when Gen. McDougal gave him a furlough to visit Massachusetts. After an absence of seven months he reported for duty at Westpoint and again entered service, August 15. In January, 1783, independence of the United States being well assured, no active duty seemed of be in sight; the routine of camp life having lost some of its charms, and longing to be again with his family in a new home, he resigned his commission, returned his sword to the scabbard, bade adieu to his old comrades in arms, and returned to his family at thenew home he had provided in Holden, Worcester county, -Harwich being no longer the place of his abode, - where he continued to reside the closing years of his eventful life, commanding the respect of the people of the place. There were many interesting incidents in the life of Capt. Webb while his long and continuous service of seven and one-half years in the cause of liberty that were known to his family, to the children of his brother, John, and to those who served under him that period of time, showing his adroitness and intrepidity in charge of hazardous enterprises; his dexterity as a submarine leader; summary dealings with pugilists and political carpers of tory proclivities. But it is a matter of regret that these incidental relations have not all reached out time. An incident related by one of his kinsmen serves to show the valor and firmness of Capt. Webb in an emergency, and how he, by proper maneuvering of his men, escaped capture and when unexpectedly met by the enemy. He was out on a foraging expedition which had required the greatest precaution to insure success, but which on this occasion was without avail. While on his march he was interpreted bu a large party of English, and shortly was ordered to surrender. Although greatly outnumbered and hard pushed, he scornfully resented the command and laconically replied, "Come and take me if you can!" So fighting and retreating, weach man doing his very best for some hours, at last a relief party from the main army met him, and his command was saved from capture though hotly pressed. The

year in which Capt. Webb had his family removed from the old home in Harwich to Worcester county is not yet precisely known. It is a matter of record, however, that he begain to purchase land in Holden in 1780 while yet in the army. His first purchase there as made of Simeon Lyons of that town of a very large tract of land, June 12, that year. At this time he claimed Harwich as his place of residence. His next purchase there was December 25, 1782, of John Jolls of several large parcesl, amounting to many acres. at this date he is mentioned as of Holden. Subsequently he made more purchases of land in that town; and upon his leaving the army, as already stated in January, 1783, he went to Holden* and became a citizen. His removal from Harwich to that town was probably encouraged by his only brother, John Webb, who had left the seafaring business and made Hardwick, a town near by, his home. The house occupied by Capt. George Webb is yet standing in Holden and known as the "Webb house." In 1913, a Chapter of the D.A.R. was instituted in Holden which bears his name [p.11] The death of Capt. Webb occurred August 25, 1825, at the age of 85. He lies buried in Holden and the grave is marked by a stone with an inscription. His widow, ann, died August 2, 1827, at the age of 85 years. Under the pension act of 1818, he applied for and received a pension, which he continued to receive as long as he lived. Capt. Webb ws held in high esteem by his townsmen and at times selected for official positions. He was early a member of the "Society of Cincinnati" of Massachusetts, which was formed in 1783, and was such at the time of his death. Capt. Webb was a man of great valor and resolution, which were tempered by good judgement. He was cautious when it was necessary and resolute when resolution was needed. No duty assigned him was neglected. By nature he was fitted for a higher position in the army of patriots than a captain, but he would not allow promotion. He was contented with his captain's commission. When once asked if he would accept a colonel's commission, his answer was, "It's a pity to spoil a good captain to make a poor colonel."




Figure 110: SPM111




Figure 109: SPM110





Figure 111: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988




Figure 114: sears bethiah Itr to Peter signature





Figure 116: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988




Figure 118: 16290 docs_Page_1




Figure 120: 16290 docs_Page_3




Figure 119: 16290 docs_Page_2




Figure 121: 16290 docs_Page_4




Figure 122: 16290 docs_Page_5




Figure 124: 16290 docs_Page_7




Figure 123: 16290 docs_Page_6




Figure 125: Marriage Record from Town Clerk





Figure 127: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988





Figure 128: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988




Figure 130: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988





Figure 132: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988




Figure 134: SPM205




Figure 136: 1800 United States Federal Census




Figure 135: SPM206





Figure 137: 1820 United States Federal Census






Figure 138: SPM130





Figure 140: Connecticut, Town Marriage Records, pre-1870 (Barbour Collection)








Figure 142: Connecticut, Town Marriage Records, pre-1870 (Barbour Collection)





Figure 143: Early Connecticut Marriages




Figure 144: Connecticut, Hale Cemetery Inscriptions and Newspaper Notices, 1629-1934








Figure 146: Connecticut, Church Record Abstracts, 1630-1920





Figure 149: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988





Figure 151: spm246

- -All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate I give to said Alpheus Hardy, Horatio Harris and Hugh Montgomery, their heirs and assigns, as joint tenants in trust, to hold, invest and manage, and take care of the same according to their best knowledge and discretion, and I wish them to invest one-half part of said estate in bottom mortgages on estates which shall be considered of twice the value of the money loaned thereon, the title of sch estates to be well examined. I give to my son, Joshua M Sears, the sum of thirty-thousand dollars, to be paid to him at the age of twenty-one years. All such parts of the income of my estate which may be necessary for the support and education of my son, I order to be used for that purpose, and when he shall be twenty-one years old, I direct that four thousand dollars shall be paid to him annually; when he shall be twenty-five years old, six thousand dollars per year, and ten thousand dollars per year when he shall be thirty-five years old. It was wise in him and in those who advised him, that he fully executed what was done, making that part of his intention sure, and all will agree that this partial and incomplete will 'is much better than none, and all that could be obtained under the circumstances,' using the language of one of the executors. The result is simply an admonition to all the men to attend to so important a duty before the last suffering hours of life."

Josh was an early bird, sunrise rarely found him under the sheets; if there was a worm to be caught he was sure to catch it. time we write of, Boston controlled full three-quarters of the West India trade of the country, and the daily arrival of severl [sic] cargoes of molasses in the season was no unusual occurrance. We have sold our birthright in it since to New York, as we have nearly every thing else that once gave us a commercial pre-eminence, and for something else than a mess of pottage. A cargo of molasses was classified after being landed on the pier, as sour for distilling, and sweet for retail, and after the cargo was landed and quaged by the Custom House official, it was offered by sale. If it was a fair average cargo it was offered to the jobbers, the price being fixed upon the hogsheads as they ran. Josh would often buy several hundred hogsheads, and resell to the smaller jobbers he of course always bought them 'as they run' but not till after he knew exactly how they did run. Now every one knew that Josh Sears was a very shrewd buyer, but how he always managed to get the best retailing molasses out of a cargo, without getting any sour hogsheads, passed the understanding of importers and buyers, till at last a very shrewd importer, whom we will call G---, had his suspicions that the early prowling propensities of Josh meant something besides exercise to get up A cargo of molasses having arrived to his consignment, he determined to watch. So taking his position early one morning where he could see unobserved, he waited. Not long after a well known individual was seen approaching, bung driver and broomstick in hand, accompanied by two Irishmen. Said individual proceeded to try the molasses, and upon every hogshead that proved satisfactory he placed a small private mark. When he had selected the quantity he wanted, he ordered the men to toll them

into a certain position and then left the wharf before anyone was stirring. As soon as he was out of hearing, G--- jumped from his hiding place, with a laugh "Ah!" said he, "I have it. Josh, old fellow, you are done now." He immediately procured a large gang of men, shifted the hogsheads, replacing them with others, taking the precaution to put the same private chalk mark on, and leaving a few of the original private inspections at the head of each tier for Josh to try. Shortly after returning to the counting room Josh entered as expected. 'Well, G---, what are you asking for the Ellsworth's cargo?' 'Fair cargo?' 'Twenty-eight cents.' 'Yes.' 'Go and look at it now?' Where is it landed?' This last question was almost too much for G---'s gravity. 'Bartlett's wharf; well, come along.' Arrived at the wharf Josh cast his eye keenly along the hogsheads: there were big marks. All right, and then he went through the form of trying several hogsheads at the head of each tier. They proved satisfactory. 'Think it will run about like this, G--?' 'I don't know. Ther it is; take it as you find it.' 'Well, I'll take thos six tiers, send up as soon as you can, and take off the gauges,' and Josh putting on his big S in chalk, they both left. Josh, as usual, immediately ordered up the ten hogsheads as a sample. Well aware of this custom, G--- had arranged to have ten good ones sent. In due time they arrived, and were deposited on the sidewalk at the back of the store. Invitations were sent out to the jobbers to come and inspect; they came, everything was satisfactory, the balance was sold at a handsome advance, clerk was sent down to deliver, gauges were taken off, book-keeper made out the bills. Josh was sitting down at the old desk, pleasantly calculating the net profits of his dodge, when suddenly his reverie was disturbed by the entrance of Mr. A., with 'Look here, Sears, that molasses you sent me is sour.' Enter Mr. B. 'That molasses is not what I bought; it is sour.' 'What?' is!' Enter Mr. C. loquitur. 'Every hogshead of that confounded molasses is sour.' This was too much; up jumped the irate Josh and put for G---'s counting room. G---'Look here, G---,' says Josh, 'that molasses I bought of you has soured mighty suddenly, or else you have given me what I did not buy. I'd like to have it explained. 'Certainly, Mr. Sears, there is a peculiarity about this'South side' molasses; if it is disturbed by rolling the hogsheads before sunrise, it invariably sours, and I have been thinking that perhaps some---Josh stopped to hear no more, but jamming his hat fiercely over his right ear, and plunging his hands in his pockets, left without a word.

I stumbled across mention of another sailboat that was built for Sears by the person who built the x (famous Cup winner) - and that boat is still in existence. entry of Pg 6 that JMS Jr died in an auto accident in 1908 is so good - I have the newspaper articles about this from several sources, and can pretty much draw up the story about that in blood-curdling detail. They include photos of him. I also have a lot more information about JMS Jr - I got so nosy as to obtain his grades from Harvard and Fascinating - they tell a great tale about him. Part of my article is too that he had a sincere interest in archaeology. He took a considerable break after graduation, went to Greece, and wrote a long article (which I also have) about some dockside "ship sheds" there. The article was published in an academic journal. Very interesting. The kid in some ways was a social flibbertigibbet, but had his specific interests and did seem to actually care about selected things. The son of a Revolutionary patriot? ... He has made a fortune because he couldn?t help it.? Estimated net worth: \$1,500,000. This profile however chides Mr. Sears because he had remained a bachelor, and that marriage would have made him ?a better and a greater man.? [R.M. Wells? quotes from ?History of Cape Cod: Annals of Barnstable County?, page 234:] ?He removed from Yarmouth to Boston in 1808, and soon engaged in business on Long Wharf, continuing in the same store till the close of his life, and accumulated a large property. He was . . a great reader, with a tenacious memory, enabling him to repeat much that he had read, even whole pages of The Iliad (Pope?s translation). Articles of noticeable ability were often written by him for the papers.? The obituary of his son noted of the father that he was ?Joshua Sears, a Boston merchant, who laid the foundation of the family fortune in a grocery store on Long wharf. There the older amassed money as a dealer in West Indian goods and other foreign commodities. The elder Sears was noted for his great thrift, and as one indication of this, it is said he even slept in his store for many years, and that he did not find time to marry until after he was 50 years old. His wife [Phebe C. Snow] was the daughter of a Boston merchant [Robert Snow Dea.] of some prominence and brought to him considerable wealth at the time of their union.? No other source has suggested wealth from the Snow family. Although he perhaps ?slept in his store for many years?, an article written in 1884 for ?The Bay State Monthly - a Massachusetts Magazine? itemizing all Taverns of Boston from its earliest times included: ?The Franklin House was built in 1830, and stood on the west side of Merchants row, between North Market and North streets, opposite the head of Clinton street. It was a favorite resort of Eastern people. Joshua Sears, an eminent merchant on Long wharf, made it his home for several years.? The Franklin House, according

to the Boston City Directory of 1870, was located at 24 North Street, Boston. The 1845 Directory of Boston does list Sears (#18500) with his business as ?W.I. Goods?, A few years later, the 1850 Census at 14 Long Wharf, and no residence shown. shows that he resided in the town of Brookline, County of Norfolk, in the residence of Seth T. Thayer, age 51, also a merchant. Also in the home were Mrs. Thayer (Elizabeth), seven children from the ages of sixteen to three, and an Irish servant girl named Catherine Hayes, age 22. Brookline is a suburb to the west of Boston, and it seems surprising that a ?workaholic? like Joshua Sears would be living out in the periphery of town. But it was possible to commute from Brookline into Boston from 1847 (or 1848) via the Brookline Branch of the Boston Worcester Steam Railway, which opened around that time. The 1850 Directory of Boston also shows (at #13199): Joshua Sears / W.I. Goods, business address 14 Long Wharf, ?house at Brookline?. In ?The Proper Bostonians? (E.P. Dutton 1947), Cleveland Amory wrote of the merchants who founded the great fortunes during the first half of the 19th century: ? .. a Cabot, a Derby, a Sears, an Endicott, a Peabody, a Crowninshield, and many others. All represent First Family names today, and yet all were men who, if not actually pirates, were at least Vikings in their methods. If they were above the triangular traffic of Colonial days - when rum was taken to Africa, slaves from Africa to the West Indies, and molasses from the West Indies back to Boston - they were not averse to an occasional sally into the opium trade. To ease their New England consciences, rum was technically known as ?West Indies Goods?... ? .. 1878 .. is a sort of generally regarded curfew when the recognized merchant era came to a close. . the Golden Gates to Boston?s First Familyland clanged shut, and, generally speaking, they have remained shut ever since. Even the word ?merchant?, in the Old English sense it had up to that time always been used - as a man who .. ?trafficks to remote countries? - died out in the Boston language. ?When the sea captain and the ?real? merchant were gone, the era was over. He [an industrialist] was never quite on a par with the real merchant. He was never, for example, a merchant prince; that title was reserved exclusively for the men whose offices were on the wharves.? certainly includes Joshua Sears. His business included many elements. Among them was joint ownership of at least one clipper ship, the Ocean Pearl, launched on August 15, 1853. It was owned by ?Alpheus Hardy, Joshua Sears, and others?; her first captain was Winthrop Sears. A principal element of course was also import /export, including purchasing merchandise just arrived from around the world, including the West Indies, and reselling it to local merchants for the retail trade. L. Ray Sears has found an article originally published in The Boston Commercial Bulletin in 1866, which gives one example of Sears? legendary shrewdness in trade, by a story of ?Josh? Sears? practice in purchase of newly-arrived molasses. It told how he rose earlier than any others, surreptitiously tested all the newly-arrived cargo as to being sweet or sour, and then purchased only those he had marked as desirable. As molasses, in this story, was offered at twenty-eight cents (per hogshead, apparently), it can be inferred that he had to have had many other irons in the fire to have amassed his fortune. In 1851 Sears was one of the founders of the Cape Cod Association. This was a small group of Cape men then living in Boston, who met there to keep their hometown ties, and ?to encourage and promote among all native-born and descendants of Cape Cod, temperance, industry, sincerity, good humor, charity, the social affections and generous sentiments.? The first meeting was held at the American House in Boston - besides Sears, a Crocker, three Thachers, a Hallett, a Nickerson and others. original gathering was social and intended to be a chance for displaced Cape Codders to get together, they were businessmen too and immediately drafted a constitution, a schedule of meetings, and a list of membership fees. In 1876 (twenty years after Sears had died), the organization began its program of granting college scholarships to native Cape Cod students, and that program has survived, and thrives to the present

dav. Sears married Phebe Snow in February 1854. S.P. May wrote ?His married Massachusetts Vital Records shows that they were life was brief, but happy.? married in Brookline, MA on February 18th, 1854. Joshua gave his age as 60 (not accurate; he was 62), and she as 35. His parents were shown as Ebenezer and Hannah, and her father only was listed (Robert Snow). Both were shown as residents of Brookline. An obituary of Joshua Sears a few years later cites Phebe as ?daughter of Deacon Snow, of Brewster, Mass?. There is a B&B in Yarmouth, an imposing Greek Revival house, called ?The Inn at Cape Cod?. Charles Sears did own it at one time, and the property is included in Phebe Sears? death is reported as taking a later inventory of Joshua Sears? estate. place in Yarmouth Port - possibly in the Greek Revival house, but of that there is no specific proof. It does not seem to match with Joshua Sears? nature to have built, or owned a weekend residence so distant from his work, but this appears to be the case. The Yarmouth newspaper reported on January 5, 1855: ?Died - in this village, 1st inst., Mrs. Phebe C., wife of Joshua Sears, Esq., age 34.? And on the next page: ?Sudden Death. It is with extreme regret that we learn the melancholy intelligence of the decease of the estimable wife of our friend Joshua Sears, Esq. at Yarmouth, on Monday morning - just one week after the birth of their only child. This afflicting dispensation will be severely felt by a large circle of friends, besides the bereaved husband, [Courier]? Massachusetts Vital Records indicates that her cause of death was ?puerperal fever (childbed fever)?, and age at death 34 years. (Either this or the 35 at time of marriage Just two years later, Joshua Sears died on Saturday, February 7, 1857. Although having been ill for ?some weeks?, he only wrote his Will on Thursday, One obituary says that he died at ?the residence of his sister-in-law, Mrs. T.W. Sears, in South Boston, at half past 12 o?clock on Saturday morning.? [The 1845 Directory of Boston showed Eliza Sears? [?widow?] residence as ?house 32 Fourth?.] Another obituary states that he died at ?the house of Mr. Hinckley, who married the widow of the late Thomas W. Sears, to whom and to whose family Mr. Sears was very much attached. ??Sears died in 1857, leaving a will by which he

devised that his son should have a certain annual income from his estate, then estimated to be worth \$1,500,000. . . the trustees, Alpheus Hardy, Horatio Harris, and Hugh Montgomery, were instructed to provide for the education of J. In the second history of Yarmouth, ?Town of Yarmouth, Massachusetts: A History 1639-1989?, on page 75: ?In 1905 a follow-up on the Joshua Sears legacy for a nautical school came by letter from Isaiah Bray in Honolulu to E. Lawrence Jenkins of the school committee: ?It may be of interest to you to know that the plan matured, and I for one received some of its benefits. A room was arranged in the southeast corner of the second story of the Yarmouth High School building, and all necessary instruments, charts, tables, etc. were provided and the windows put on hinges to swing open. Pans of quicksilver were placed in open windows, and with sextants we used this for an artificial horizon. A good many Cape boys went to sea then, and for a few years at least I know a number of them who used the room and the instruments to learn to get the latitude and longitude.?? Either way, a rather sad product for a beguest of \$15,000! In the Yarmouth Register December 1905, a reporter undertook a history of the Yarmouth Schools from a review of the minutes of the school board. ?1861 - The records state that it was voted to confer with the Trustees of the Sears fund and arrange for the opening of a nautical school, as provided for in the will of Joshua Sears. Mr. Sears was, or had been rather, a nautical man, and had made a fortune in the shipping business; when he died, he left a fund of several thousand dollars to the town to found a nautical school, and I believe for other school purposes. The records say nothing further about this school, and whether it was started or not I do not know.? Joshua Sears? death was immediately noted in all the Boston papers, and of course in Yarmouth as well. Taken together, they provide possibly the most vivid view of him that can be had today: ?.. the well known wholesale grocer .. has been what may be called a fixture on Long Wharf, where he has conducted business with strict integrity for many years. .. Throughout his mercantile career he has seemed to sacrifice comfort and ease to amassing a fortune, in which he has been remarkably successful.? Boston Evening Traveler, February 7, 1857, pg 2. ?.. he possessed great shrewdness, which, combined with remarkable business talent, and indomitable perseverance and industry, enabled him to accumulate a very large fortune. .. He always retained a great regard for his native town, and has repeatedly sent money to one of his brothers who resides there, with directions to distribute it for the relief of the poor and needy in the place.? Boston Daily Advertiser, February 9, 1857, pg 2. ? .. He was frugal and simple in his habits, and his strictly personal expenses were remarkably small for one of his means. He was very decided in his likes and dislikes, and not at all backward in expressing them.? (!) Yarmouth Register, February 13, 1857, pg 2. ? .. He was a man of marked peculiarities (!), was always just and honest in his dealings, was frugal, temperate, painstaking and industrious, farseeing and forereaching. He was a man of decided independence of character, and was a quick judge of the character of others, was somewhat eccentric and not always regardful of his personal appearance. He

accumulated a large fortune, which he enjoyed very little himself, except the satisfaction of ownership. Boston Daily Courier, February 9, 1857, pg 1. [Reflecting on some of above details, it is interesting to wonder what was in the mind of spinster Phebe Snow, at the age of 35 (in the 1850s, certainly an age when a single lady would be utterly past the hope of marrying) - agreeing to marry this much older man with the many ?marked peculiarities.? We must assume they found each other pleasant companions. Clearly, he constituted her "very last chance". I won't consider the idea that Phebe was a fortune-hunter!]






Figure 154: 5572c.jpg




Figure 157: spm246



Figure 158: Massachusetts, Death Records, 1841-1915




Figure 159: Massachusetts, Mason Membership Cards, 1733-1990





Figure 160: Massachusetts, Wills and Probate Records, 1635-1991




Figure 162: spm246





Figure 163: SPM247


Figure 165: 1880 United States Federal Census





Figure 168: SPM248







Figure 169: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988






Figure 170: SPM248




Figure 171: SPM249





Figure 172: SPM250






Figure 175: SPM397




Figure 174: SPM395




Figure 176: SPM398




Figure 177: 1860 United States Federal Census





Figure 178: Massachusetts, Death Records, 1841-1915







Figure 181: North America, Family Histories, 1500-2000





Figure 182: Massachusetts, Death Records, 1841-1915




Figure 184: Massachusetts, State Census, 1865





Figure 186: 1880 United States Federal Census




Figure 190: SPM399




Figure 192: 1910 United States Federal Census



Figure 193: Massachusetts, State Census, 1865





Figure 194: 1880 United States Federal Census






Figure 196: taken by Ray




Figure 197: Mar2011 462David H Sears[7444]




Figure 198: 10442 Mar2011 463LauraASears.jpg



Figure 199: Massachusetts, Death Records, 1841-1915




Figure 200: 1880 United States Federal Census




Figure 201: Massachusetts, Death Index, 1901-1980





Figure 202: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988



- II. Captain Paul Sears, son of Richard1 Sears was born probably at Marblehead, Massachusetts, 1637-8, after February 20, died at Yarmouth, February 20,1707-8. Paul Sears took the oath of fidelity, as the freeman's oath was some-times called in 1657. p.190 He was Captain of the militia company at Yarmouth and was in the Narragansett war. He was one of the original proprietors of Harwich, which was laid out be-tween Bound Brook & Stony Brook as Wing's purchase. He married at Yarmouth,1658, Deborah Willard, dau. of George Willard. She was baptized at Scituate in the Plymouth colony by Rev. William Witherall, Sept. 14, 1645; died at Yarmouth, May 13, 1721. Her mother was probably Dorothy Dunster. Their children were:

Samuel and Elizabeth (Sparrow)Freeman. John Sears lived in the east precinct of Yarmouth, now East Dennis,Mass. He joined the church June 23, 1728. He was prominent and wealthy. He served the town of Yarmouth as moderator, assessor and member of the prudential committee. He was highway surveyor in 1712; fence viewer in 1720, selectman 1734-34; ensign in the militia 1722, lieutenant, 1726, captain in 1736. He enlisted in 1863 in Company F, First Battallion, Heavy Artillery, and remained in the service for one year, as guartermaster's sergeant. In August, 1865, upon his discharge from the army, he returned to Millbury and opened a drug store. He conducted this business successfully until he became postmaster of Millbury in 1898. He sold his store to Mr. Appel in 1900, who still owns it. Mr. Sears is still serving as postmaster. Mr. Sears is a leader in the Republican Party. He represented the town of Mill-bury in the legislature in 1890. He has a wide acquaintance in the Masonic Order, having taken all the degrees including the 32nd. He has been on the cemetery committee of the town of Millbury thirty-four years and town treasurer for two years. He is chairman of the parish committee of the Unitarian Church. No man in Millburry is better known by his townsmen, and no one is respected more, liked more, honored more and trusted more. His first wife was Anna E. Moore, daughter of Dr. William B. and Sarah Moore, of Millbury. She was born in Millbury, September 3, 1836, died 1860. He m. (2)at Petersham, Mass., May 28, 1868, Luthera B. NATHAN H. SEARS

Nathan Henry Sears was born at Brewster, Mass. In 1848, he moved to Worcester where he worked on leather goods. In 1853 he came to Millbury where he was foreman for the firm of Johnson, Brown and Co. who manufactured leather goods. He kept a drug store from 1865 until 1898.

Mr. Sears was a prominent citizen in many lines of activity. He was for a number of years a member of the fire department and part of the time was its chief, having one of the steam fire-negines named in his honor. For over forty years he was commissioner of cemeteries, much of the time being chairman of the board. During this period the condition and appearance of the cemeteries was greatly improved, a change in which he took much pride. He caused the graves of Revolutionary soldiers to be marked. He has long been identified with leadership in the Republican party. He represented the district for a term in the State Legislature. For sixteen years, i. e., from 1898 until 1914, Mr. Sears was postmaster. He was town treasurer for two years in 1872 and 1873.

Mr. Sears served two enlistments in the Civil War, the first being with the Tenth Unsttached Co. and the second with Co. F., 1st battalion of heavy artillery, both terms of service being at Fort Warren in Boston Harbor.

Mr. Sears was a member of the Unitarian Society of Millbury in whose affairs he ever took a warm interest. He was a member of George A. Custer Post 70, G. A. R. He was a prominent Mason, having taken thirty-two degrees in that order.




Figure 206: 1890 Veterans Schedules




Figure 209: Massachusetts, Mason Membership Cards, 1733-1990




Figure 210: Massachusetts, State Census, 1855




Figure 212: U.S., Civil War Draft Registrations Records, 1863-1865




Figure 214: 1880 United States Federal Census





Figure 215: Massachusetts, Death Records, 1841-1915





Figure 216: 1900 United States Federal Census




Figure 219: SPM513E





Figure 221: California, Voter Registers, 1866-1898




